Young Voices

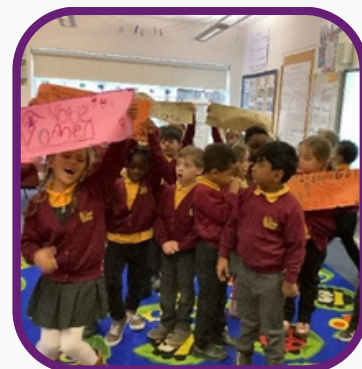

What has been happening at Great Horwood this term?

Escape from Pompeii

In English, this term, Maples have been reading *Escape from Pompeii*. The children created newspaper reports and informed the rest of Italy about how the volcano erupted. They also had the opportunity to create Roman mosaics on the school computers, designing intricate patterns and seeing how each individual square contributes to the whole.

People who help us

As part of this term's topic, Acorns have looked at lots of different pictures of people who help us and discussed how and why. The class were very lucky to have visits from a Nurse and a Prison Officer to explain the jobs that they do. The children have shown such curiosity around exploring where people who help us are in our community!



Space

Hawthorns have been delving into *'Hidden Figures'* by Margot Shelly and have explored the interesting yet challenging lives of the four incredible, African-American women: Mary Jackson, Dorothy Vaughan, Katherine Johnson and Christine Darden. In music, the children have been recreating the opening music for the



Superman film (originally by John Williams) to create atmosphere and suspense. Working in small groups, the children composed their own short piece of music, matching it to the visuals in the opening credits.

On Safari

Conkers have been learning all about Africa, and specifically Kenya. The class have explored the savannahs and national parks, used maps, atlases and globes to find out more about our world and Africa, and can now identify the 'Big Five' animals. The children have also created some collages inspired by African patterns and landscapes.

Peace Club

Longwick C of E School have recently been allocated a space on the Peer Mentoring Scheme with Bucks Mind. This Support in Schools Service is available to Primary Schools in Buckinghamshire and East Berkshire. It provides training for children, enabling them to offer listening support to their fellow students and become mental health ambassadors. The training includes mental health awareness, mentor responsibilities, development of communication and listening skills, and understanding the importance of confidentiality and safeguarding. At Longwick, Year 5 and 6 children were invited to apply for the position of Peace Leader. The Children chosen recently received Peer Mentor Training, which they will put to use in a new lunchtime Peace Club. The school's hope is that this club will be an inclusive, spiritual and safe space for all children in the school and will encourage students to seek support when they need it.

Year 4 residential

This month, Longwick's Year 4 children went to Woodrow on a three day residential trip. We were so pleased to hear so many of the children persevere with new challenges and try so many wonderful activities. They came back with an air of confidence and pride which was so lovely to see. 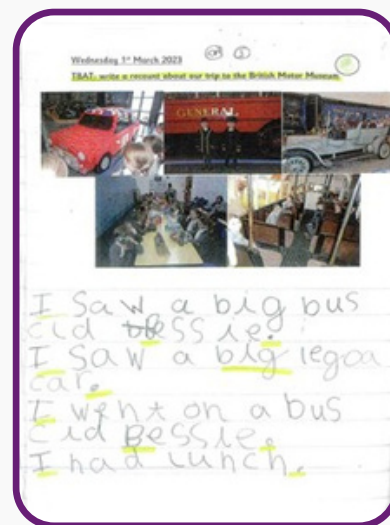
The great outdoors

Junior Road Safety Officer success

This term St Mary's have some exciting news to share about all the hard work their Junior Road Safety Officers (JRSO) undertake to support their school travel plan. Across the country 3,500 schools signed up to Modeshift STARS, the



organisation that promotes road safety and safe travel to and from school, to keep track of all the initiatives that they complete to help keep the roads safe for everyone. Examples of the work the JRSO's deliver include communications sent out from school, walk to school weeks, road safety assemblies and travel surveys.

Thanks to the JRSO's St Mary's was one of just 125 schools across the country that was nominated for the 2023 National Awards and in Buckinghamshire there were only 10 Primary and 1 Secondary Schools nominated. One Friday, they were invited to attend the virtual Modeshift STARS Regional Awards along with the other nominated schools in

the area. Mrs Clark, their School Travel Plan Co-Ordinator, the JRSO's and Year 6 all tuned in to the awards ceremony, watched with bated breath, and were overjoyed when St Mary's was announced as the winning Primary School in the region!



Promoting sustainable ways to travel to and from school is a great way to help develop the Net Zero target that the ODBST have signed up to as well as ensuring that all the road users in our communities can use and keep the streets as safe as possible.

The school and ODBST are so proud of all the hard work that the JRSO's and Mrs Clark do and I am sure that you will join me in celebrating with them.

What has been happening in the Shared Services Team this term?

Keeping our schools safe - Enhanced site security

Safeguarding is always a priority at the ODBST. We wanted all our schools to have a visitor management system to manage entry into and exit out of our school buildings. We are so pleased that all our schools now have this system in place.

InVentry is the visitor management system we are using in all our schools. Initially it was developed for use in the Education system and subsequently adopted by other sectors including in care homes, in the NHS, to name a few, due to its audit and compliance capabilities. The InVentry system helps our schools track those who visit their premises. For schools, the simple sign in book is outdated and no longer sufficient, they now have higher security requirements such as ID badges, DBS checks and GDPR compliance, all of which InVentry can aid them with.



InVentry links with the school's Management Information System (Bromcom) so when children arrive late, they sign in on the system and the attendance marks are recorded in Bromcom. This allows the school to accurately monitor attendance at all times. In addition, as the system is integrated with the register system, if a child needs to leave school early due to a medical appointment or illness, the register for evacuation situations will be automatically updated. This works in the same way for school staff who are issued with ID cards which have a unique barcode. They use these to register their attendance on site by signing in and out across the day. This means that the school has accurate records as to who is on site at any time so staff are offered the same protection in the event of an emergency evacuation.

All visitors to the school will sign in using the InVentry system electronically using the interactive sign in screen which, in turn, then produces a photo ID badge which is worn throughout the visitor's time on school premises.

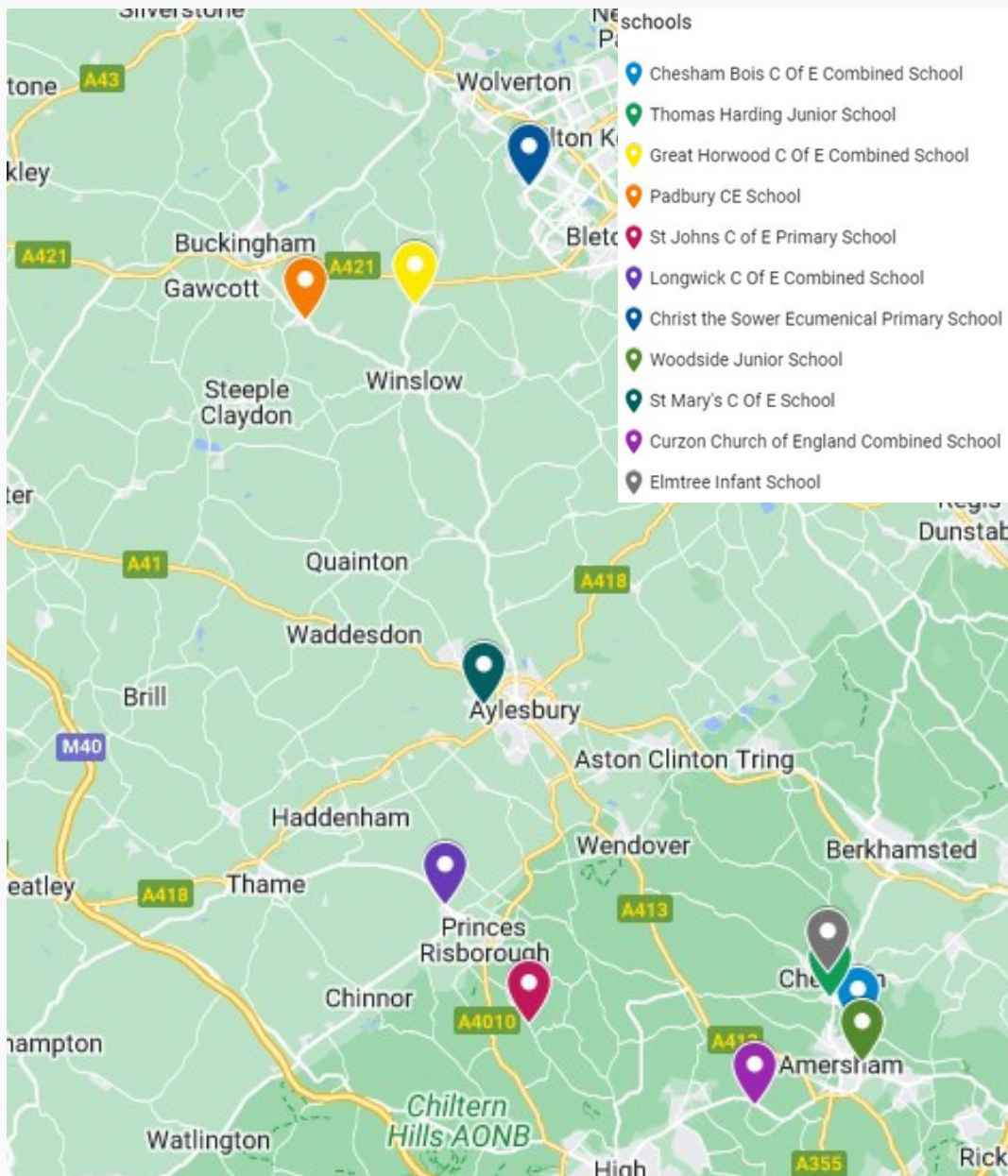
